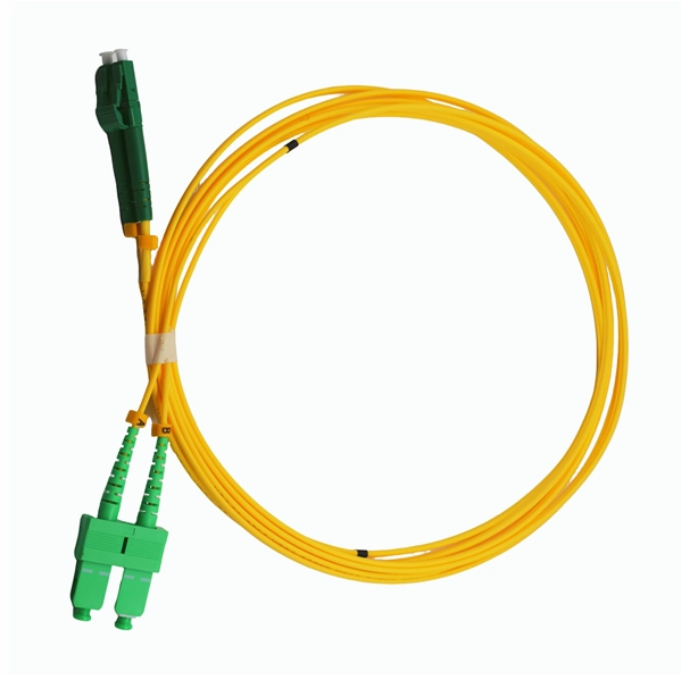


Can a 3000-meter fiber optic cable be used

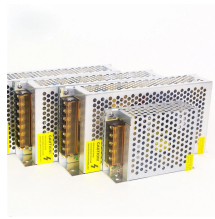
Fiber optic cable can be run anywhere from 300 meters up to 80 kilometers (roughly 50 miles) depending on the cable type, transceiver used, and network standard. Fiber optic cable transmission distance is determined by two primary physical factors that affect signal quality as light travels through the fiber medium. For most enterprise or data center applications using multimode fiber, the practical limit sits between 300 m and 550 m. These two types require different electronic equipment. Proterial Cable America's standard singlemode glass is labeled as OS2. Using a fiber size chart simplifies cable selection and ensures compliance with industry standards (TIA, ISO, ITU-T). 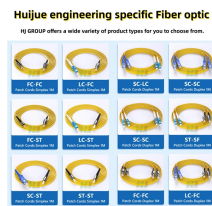
