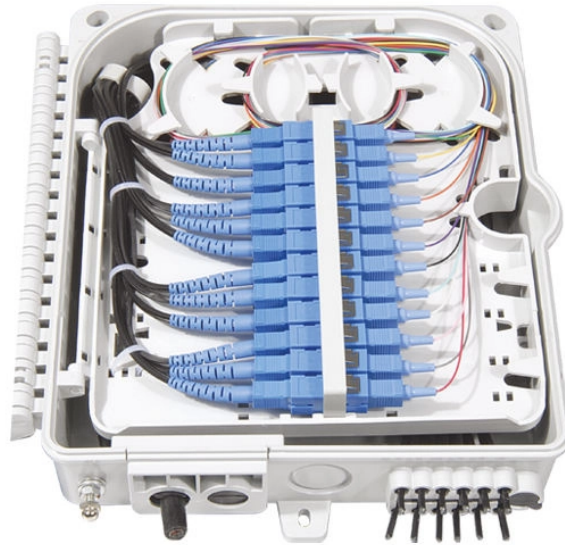


## National Optical Cable in 2012



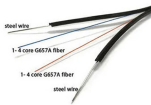
### Overview
