Overview

Inspect the splice enclosure for any damage or defects. Verify that all components are accounted for. They are engineered systems designed to protect fiber splices from mechanical stress, environmental exposure, and long-term performance degradation. Strip the fiber. 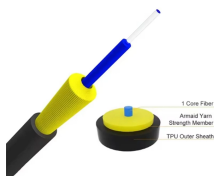

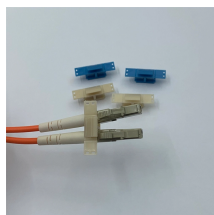
