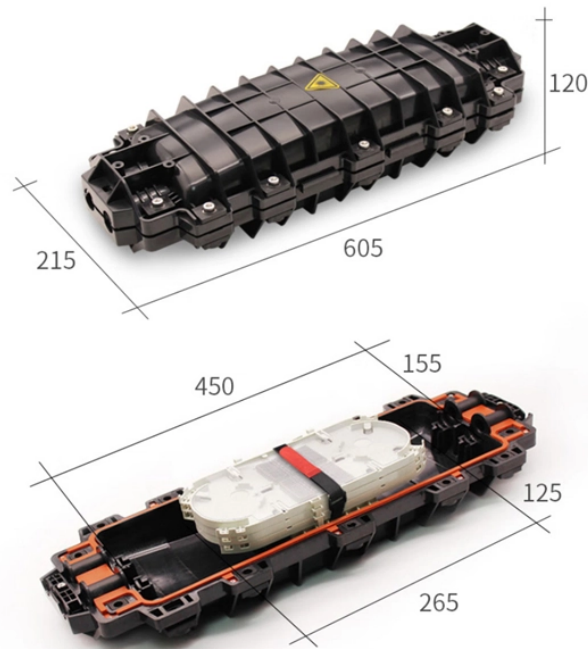


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Sudan Costs CFP8NRZ



Overview

Even under the most optimistic scenario of peace being achieved in 2026, Sudan would still lose an estimated \$18.8bn in its gross domestic product (GDP) by 2043, the report said, illustrating just how deeply the war has already reshaped the country's economic trajectory. 14 April 2026, Khartoum – Sudan could see extreme poverty rise above 60 percent, with an additional 34 million people pushed into deprivation, if the current conflict continues until 2030, according to a major new analysis released today, on the eve of the war's third anniversary. 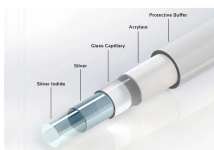
